General Assembly :

Also on the agenda was the distribution of Mathematics Competition awards by Mrs Clark, a report on the Year 8/9 sport competition run by Zoe Van Kalken and Sarah Wardle of Year 12 and a fashion parade from Mrs Smith's Year 9/10 Fashion Design class. A welcome addition to our assembly was the set of steps, constructed by Mr Kennett that allowed direct access to the stage from the gym floor.

Music Night :

Our instrumental music students and staff will entertain us tonight at our Music Night in the east campus Hall. The music starts at 7.00pm so make sure you are there on time. Last year the night was a great success and enormously entertaining and, having heard our choir rehearsing, I am sure tonight will provide more of the same. I would like to congratulate our musicians and singers in advance for what I know will be a wonderful night. I would also like to thank our music teachers who give so much of their own time to provide tuition to get our student to the point where they can perform in front of an audience.

Dental Health:

I was contacted two weeks ago by the dentist working at the Western District Health Service dental clinic. I was asked to let members of our community know that the dental service was available for dental checks and dental work. Dental Health Services Victoria recommends that children have a dental check-up at least once every two years. The dental service is free to any students whose family has a health care card. Once contact is made with the service and appointments scheduled, the

Western District Health Service dental clinic, will retain contact and will make regular appointments for check-ups. I urge any family that qualifies to contact WDHS to take advantage of the dental services they provide. The number is **555 18347**. The clinic is open for appointments between 9.00am and 4.00pm.

Interim Reports :

Staff have now completed interim reports for all students so that they will be ready for distribution tomorrow, Friday 21st September. Parents should note an important change in the reporting. The section titled 'work standard' will now contain a comment that represents the VELs level for that student. The comment will let parents know whether a student is at the expected standard, above it or below it and by how much. This is the case for all reports for students from Year 1 to Year 10. This is a very important part of the year when decisions about promotion are being made so I urge parents and students alike to take notice of their report and ensure that they are not at risk of having to repeat a year of study.

Last Day of term :

Friday 21st September is the last day of term III. Students will be dismissed at 2.30pm and they will have been given their interim reports to bring home with them. Term IV will begin on Monday 8th October.

Professional Development Day :

After cancelling our professional development day on Sheepvention Monday earlier this year we have decided to reschedule to Monday 5th November. This is the day before Melbourne Cup Day. This means that Monday 5th November will be a pupil free day that Baimbridge College staff will use for professional development. The next day Tuesday 6th November will be the Melbourne Cup public holiday that our Shire Council has designated and then we will resume normal classes on Wednesday 7th November.

Personal Computers :

School Council is currently working on a proposal to extend the use of individual computers in the school. The current proposal is to introduce an individual laptop for all Year 7 students in 2013. The proposal involves parents leasing a laptop for their son or daughter for Year 7 and Year 8. The introduction of the laptop lease would be part of a plan that would see a reduction in the purchase of text books for these students, with the likely alternative being the introduction of electronic text books loaded on the laptops themselves. As soon as details are finalised, including the preferred model and cost of the lease we will contact the parents of all our new 2013 Year 7 students.

BRONZE RESCUE PROGRAM Bronze Star and Bronze Medallion

Bronze Star is a secondary student award that aims to develop safe water knowledge, rescue and survival skills and includes learning basic resuscitation skills. Candidates need to be able to swim 300m using various strokes prior to participating. Candidates may be under 14 years to participate in Bronze Star.



Bronze Medallion award holders are recognised as having gained a minimum standard as a qualified lifesaver so the course will develop the level of knowledge, judgement, technique and physical ability required to carry out safe water rescues. It is advantageous if candidates hold the senior swim and survive and bronze star awards. The minimum age is 14 years (or in the year in which the candidate turns 14 years).

The Bronze Rescue skills are highly regarded in the wider community; it may even enhance your chances of starting a career through organisations such as Life Guarding Services, Fire Brigade and Police Departments since they are all employers looking to recruit people with a strong survival instinct.
