The calculators available from the East Office (Texas Instruments TI-30XB) for \$20 are suitable for use in the NAPLAN tests for both year 7 and 9.

Trip to Melbourne: Year 12 Fashion Design

In the first week of term the Year 12 Fashion Design class joined with the Year 11 and 12 Drama class to venture to Melbourne. We planned an overnight trip so that we could explore events and venues which would enhance our studies in VCE.

Prior to our trip the Fashion students had constructed individual journals which outlined 60 tasks for the students to aim to complete (it was a bit optimistic in two days!). These tasks ranged from simple observations in the street and brief sketching exercises to more in-depth analyses of factors influencing designers.

Upon arriving in Melbourne we headed to the Melbourne Museum in Carlton. We visited TOP DESIGNS. This is an exhibition of the top VCE work in Textiles and Fashion from 2011. Practical work is on display as well as folios that demonstrate the highest examples of student work. Students had tasks to complete in their journals and had the opportunity to make notes of how they could use these ideas in their work this year. (We did manage a sneak look at Phar Lap whilst we were in the museum!).

We also visited the boutique/galleries of some notable Australian designers. These included Akira Isogawa, Leona Edmiston and Gorman. Here students were able to look at the types of fabrics chosen, identify sources of inspiration and look at construction techniques. We were astounded at some of the prices for the garments but by the end of our excursion we had determined how these prices could be justified.

We took the opportunity to visit some large fabric stores within the city. This gave students the chance to discuss and observe fabric properties and the availability of amazing fabrics (some \$500 per metre!). Some students collected fabric swatches to include in their own folios.

Whilst in Melbourne we had an opportunity to experience some of the pleasures of the city – this included a great evening in an Italian restaurant in Lygon Street and hot chocolate and French macaroons in Collins Street!

It was a pleasure to take such a fun and mature group of students on an excursion such as this. We gained a lot of valuable information for our work back at school and I look forward to seeing the outcomes in the student's work throughout the year.


