Principal's Notes

Transition Day :

The Baimbridge College Year 6 to 7 transition program begins on Wednesday 18th February. State Primary Schools in the area are aware of this arrangement and we are inviting all Year 6 students to attend a day of schooling at Baimbridge College to discover what we have to offer. This will be followed by an Information Night also on the west campus on Wednesday 18th February and then tours of the school during the day on Thursday 19th February.

We trust that aligning our transition information with other schools will enable parents to make a realistic comparison of educational settings for their children.

We look forward to welcoming Year 6 students and their parents to our school and showing them the wonderful opportunities that Baimbridge College has to offer.

On this day we will be asking Year 8 students to remain at home to make space for our visitors. A letter has been sent home to parents of Year 8 students this week to explain this.

Immunisations :

On Friday next week we will be holding the immunisation program run by the shire for our years 7 and 10 students. Permission forms were sent home last week to all families with students in years 7 to 10 and need to be completed and returned to enable each student to receive their immunisation. After the 12th of February parents will have to go to the Frances Hewitt Community Centre to arrange your child's immunisation. Alerts to upcoming immunisations will appear on the newsletter and via Compass.

Parent Opinion Survey :

I was checking the results of the parent opinion survey that was distributed last year to find out what parents think and feel about our school and would like to thank those families that took the time to complete the form and send it back to be processed by the education department and the results sent to me. Unfortunately less than a quarter were returned which makes it difficult to get an overall picture of parental opinions so we will be providing another opportunity in the near future. We will be in contact soon with some specific questions we would like to have your opinion about. I look forward to reading what you have to say.

School Council :

VCE Students and Parents/Guardians

The VCAA recognises that some students with an illness or disability may require Special Examination Arrangements to enable them to access the examination questions and communicate their responses in a timed examination.

There are six categories for application:

hearing impairment	vision impairment

AN IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING TAX FILE NUMBERS

Changes to the Secondary Schools Tax File Number Program in 2015

The Secondary Schools Tax File Number (TFN) Program will not continue beyond 31 December 2014. This means that School TFN forms will no longer be processed beyond this date.

How students can apply for a TFN from 1 January 2015

The Australian Taxation Office in partnership with Australia Post is making it easier for individuals to apply for a TFN.

Students can now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

Applying online is the fastest and most convenient way for students to get a TFN. More information on applying online can be found at ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC27248'

Students who are unable to visit a participating Australia Post office will need to complete the application form Tax file number - application or enquiry for individuals form (NAT 1432). More information about lodging this form can be found at ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC22604'

The ATO will continue working with teachers to educate students about tax and superannuation. The curriculum resource Tax, Super & You is a free, easy to use, online educational resource aligned to the school curriculum of each state and territory. This resource can be accessed at taxsuperandyou.gov.au

JACPLUS PAYMENTS DUE BY FEBRUARY 13TH 2015

Dear Parents

It has been brought to our attention that some parents have not yet completed their purchase of the Jacaranda \$100 Digital Bundle for their child.

Parents are required to complete this transaction before **Friday 13th February 2015**. After this date, JACplus will be deactivating student accounts where the Digital Bundle has not been purchased. To ensure your child has full access to the eBooks and resources they need for the 2015 school year, please visit the Jacaranda Parent Portal to make your purchase.

Before you begin, you will need the following:

- Your child's student number
- A valid credit card or pre-paid debit card

To make this purchase, simply visit <https://parentportal.jaconline.com.au/bairnbridge-college>

- Select your child's year level
- Enter in your child's name and student number/email address
- Click Purchase and follow the prompts to complete the transaction.

You may have attempted to access the Portal already, but have not fully completed the purchase. If so, you may encounter one of the following problems:

- Cannot overwrite your child's name or email address
- Shopping cart is showing as empty, even though you have tried to add the \$100 Bundle

These problems can be quickly and easily overcome in one of the following two ways:

- Complete the transaction in a different web browser,

For example, if you usually use Internet Explorer , try using Google Chrome



or Mozilla Firefox



- Alternatively, you can clear the Cookies in your current web browser

Conveyance Allowance Program (CAP)

Page Content

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and private bus. The conveyance allowance is also available to eligible students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

Eligibility criteria

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located.

Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible
- reside outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Students attending a government or non-government specialist school or Department-recognised special setting must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government specialist school or Department-recognised special setting
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended
- reside within the Designated Transport Area (DTA) for the government specialist school attended (applicable to government students only) be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.
