PRINCIPAL'S NOTES

Student Representative Council :

On Monday morning we ran our second General Assembly for the term. The theme for the assembly was set by our Student Representative Council. SRC President Laura Bennetts spoke to the school explaining what the SRC was trying to achieve in 2012. She also presented Baimbridge College with a framed certificate in recognition of the fund raising the SRC undertook in 2011 to support a child in Africa.

The main part of the assembly focussed on Joseph Kony in Uganda and his crimes against humanity. The awareness raising session was led by Year 10 SRC representative Jessie Milligan. The school was shown a

short film that is available on the internet. Students were told specifically that the intention was not to raise money but to raise awareness and that they could show their support for the removal of Joseph Kony by signing a document after the assembly. Over 200 students had signed the document by the end of Monday. Jessie also invited special guests to be part of the assembly and we welcomed Mayor Councillor Bob Penny, Councillor Dr Katrina Rainsford and RSL representative Mr Arnold Kruger. Sunsmart :

Baimbridge College has a sunsmart policy that requires all students to wear a hat while outside during term I and IV of each year. I would like to commend our students and staff on their wearing of hats. The vast majority of our school population complies with these requirements well and I feel that we are making a difference to the health of our students in particular. Hats will not be compulsory in term II or III but will be required again in term IV.

School Review :

Baimbridge College is undertaking its four yearly School Review this year. A number of meetings have already been held to determine progress since our last review in 2008. Data from student achievements in NAPLAN testing and VELS levels, Student Attitude to School Surveys and both Parent and Staff Opinion surveys is being used to determine whether goals have been achieved and the directions to set the school for the next four years. Four year goals will be set under the headings of Student Learning, Student Well-Being and Engagement and Student Transitions and Pathways. Miss Rosemary Morgan is overseeing the review process and there will be opportunities for student and parent input as we get closer to our review date. An independent reviewer has been appointed to take us through the process with our initial meeting taking place in the first week of term II.

School Council elections:

Nominations for School Council are now closed. The parent nominations were equal to the number of position so I would like to welcome new member Mr Russell Milligan to School Council. I would also like to welcome back to council Mr Shaun McIntyre and Mr Ian Roberts. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Liz Anagnostou who did not re nominate for Council this time around. Liz has been a valued member of our School Council and I hope she will be able to re join us in

the not too distant future. Once our two staff positions are filled we will meet with the new Council on Monday 23rd April to fill the two community member positions that are being vacated by Mr Graeme Scott and Mrs Geraldine McDonald.

Reports :

Staff have written interim reports for students for term I. These reports are a brief guide to how students are progressing and will be distributed at the end of the school day tomorrow at 2.30pm. We will follow up the distribution of these reports with a parent / teacher interview afternoon/evening on Thursday 26th April. This interview process provides the opportunity to discuss student progress and for parents and teachers to meet early on in the academic year. Students will be provided with information about the time and venue for the interviews when they return from the term I vacation.

Student Insurance :

School Council have asked me to pass on information about student insurance to parents and families. We have received information about 24 hour per day insurance for students and feel that families should have the opportunity to investigate this further. I would like to make clear that School Council is not endorsing this product. School Council is simply making the information available to parents for them to make their own value judgements. CAREERS NEWS

*Arrangements are progressing for the Year 12 tour of Tertiary/University options covering five universities and 7 campuses.

Year 10 & 11 students are always recommended to attend the many open days these institutions have each year. Look at it as a shopping trip for your future.

*Careers Faculty have been approached to offer second year Youth Worker Students from RMIT a project to work with later in the year. A suggestion of community engagement strategies for the year 10 group through Careers and SOSE classes was suggested. The students view the offers given and take them on if they are interested.

*Students looking at Career options in Law, Commerce & Environment will be invited to an afternoon /evening with their parents to be organised by the Hamilton Careers Teachers Network around week 6 of term 2. Keep your eyes open for updates.

*TIS – Tertiary Information Services

Representatives from each of Victoria's universities, TAFEs and several independent colleges travel across the state helping Year 12 students to finalise their post-secondary study options.

Each year representatives cover hundreds of kilometres and speak to around 75 per cent of Victoria's Year 12 students providing information on the application process for tertiary courses and the range of study options available.

Keep the 18th of April free (the first Wednesday of Term 2) for the Hamilton TIS event from 1 – 3:30. Letters will be sent home this week with year 12 students giving details of the event.

*About VTAC

The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) is the central office that administers the application and offer process for places in tertiary courses at university, TAFE and independent tertiary colleges in Victoria (and a few outside Victoria). VTAC receives and forwards application information and supporting documentation to the course selection authorities at institutions. After selection decisions have been made by the course authorities at institutions, VTAC sends offer letters to successful applicants on the institutions' behalf.

The VTAC guide offers all the information needed for course selection and is available later in the year. This is the book that offers the most up to date information. Changes this year are that there will be fewer printed and the details of each course will be available on the internet.

Copies of the VTAC Guide will be available for pre-purchase via CourseLink from 7 May 2012.

Copies to the public will go on sale, via newsagents' week beginning 30 July 2012.

BRONZE RESCUE PROGRAM Bronze Star and Bronze Medallion

Bronze Star is a secondary student award that aims to develop safe water knowledge, rescue and survival skills and includes learning basic resuscitation skills. Candidates need to be able to swim 300m using various strokes prior to participating. Candidates may be under 14 years to participate in Bronze Star.



Bronze Medallion award holders are recognised as having gained a minimum standard as a qualified lifesaver so the course will develop the level of knowledge, judgement, technique and physical ability required to carry out safe water rescues. It is advantageous if candidates hold the senior swim and survive and bronze star awards. The minimum age is 14 years (or in the year in which the candidate turns 14 years).

The Bronze Rescue skills are highly regarded in the wider community; it may even enhance your chances of starting a career through organisations such as Life Guarding Services, Fire Brigade and Police Departments since they are all employers looking to recruit people with a strong survival instinct.
