This is a great programme which sees one hundred students from Across Victoria gather at the Parliament House of Victoria, in Melbourne, to debate the nature of Democracy in Australia. The Convention itself was held in the Legislative Assembly. It was a pleasing experience to sit in this grand room and be a part of a stimulating debate about democracy in Australia and how it may, or may not, be improved.

The one hundred students were split into smaller groups of 10 students and we participated in a mock Cabinet Meeting. The aim was to determine a specific course of action to improve democracy in Australia which was then voted on by all the students in attendance.

It was an excellent day which was a highly successful educational event made interesting by the views brought to the Convention by students of many different ethnic and political backgrounds.


